As I mentioned in the worship service Sunday morning, you should be proud of Maelikki Harvey. At her young age, Maelikki takes her faith very seriously, which is why I was not surprised when she approached me a couple of weeks ago and asked what our church was going to do in response to what had happened in Japan. Frankly, I hadn't given it a thought. Shame on me. I was saddened, of course, by what had transpired with the earthquake and tsunami, and the tragic results of these natural disasters. But what could I do otherwise? However, when a child awakens something in you like that, it is best to respond.

You know how we adults are, though. We have to analyze and figure and talk and discuss, and sometimes that creates a delay in our response. Maelikki continued to remind me of her concern, so I kept it on the front burner (not that Maelikki gave me any options to do otherwise!). The Deacons discussed it in their monthly meeting, and decided that under our rules and regulations we could immediately ask for our church folk to respond. Last Wednesday night, we placed rice bowls on the tables and encouraged a response. That appeal resulted in gifts of a little over \$60. Sunday morning, I brought Maelikki up before the congregation and told them the story. In addition to whatever gifts we may have received then, and in the rice bowls again this Wednesday, we will forward our offering to Charles Ray at the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of Arkansas.

As national director of disaster relief for CBF, Charles will soon be going to Japan. I would imagine that one of his goals is to hand deliver gifts from Arkansas to Baptists in Japan, so they can distribute them to those in need. It will prove to be the most direct way for us to offer our assistance, other than our prayer support. Please participate in this endeavor, if you will, and consider this ministry in your prayers and in your pocketbooks.

You can be glad that Maelikki brought this to our attention. It not only says a great deal about her, but our participation in her life and Christian growth as well. Thanks, Maelikki, and God bless you. And who knows, with all the tremors in the Greenbrier area, the folks in Japan may be coming to our aid some day!

You may not live in Hillcrest, but I do hope you have circled May 7 on your calendar. It is the opening day for our Hillcrest Farmers Market. Surely you will want to be a part of it. We will have a table, of course, with information about our church and upcoming events. You can help us as we share our good news with our neighbors. As I've said, I believe this just may be the most significant thing our church has done in many years. Come help us as we participate in this ministry.

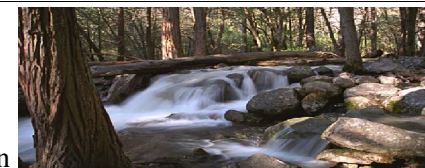
### Young at Heart
