Why don't you plan to come and be a part of it?

We'll let you know how he does. It's for certain I'll take plenty of pictures, hoping to use some of the techniques I've learned in our spring photography class, led by Willie Allen.

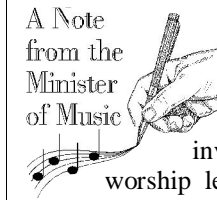
