My friend Ken Ellis knows me pretty well. He asked me this past weekend if, when we got back home, I was going to write about him in our church newsletter. He's seen me do this for so many other people over the years, he figures it's his due. And he would be right.

Ken and Sylvia became instant friends when we moved to Florida in 1986. Their two younger kids, Dawn and David (Lane is their oldest), were the ages of Emily and Tim, and even though they didn't go to school together – which, in hindsight, might not have been a bad thing – they spent a lot of time together nevertheless.

Without going into great detail, our two families went through some "stuff" together (most parents of teenagers do), and that bonded us together even more. I will recount a couple of things, however.

The Ellises built a beautiful home on the water in Palm Harbor. They gave us the grand tour just before they moved in, and when I viewed the rear elevation of the home, I told Ken they had made a big mistake. "What do you mean?" he wanted to know. I pointed to the second story balcony outside their master bedroom. It was right over the swimming pool – the deep end, no less. "How long do you think it will take one of our kids to jump from the balcony into the pool?" I said. "They better not!" was his response. Well, guess who was the first one to do it? My fearless daughter, Emily.

We made a pact that when the girls turned 16 we would not buy them cars. We couldn't afford to do it, and they figured Dawn didn't need one. However, Janet's parents bought a new car and gave their old Datsun to us for Emily to drive. I guess Ken figured that broke our pact. One day, not long after both girls had attained their driver's licenses, Ken invited us to lunch. It was a weekday, and that made his invitation a bit unusual. He was an executive with the Bic Pen Corporation, and such social occasions didn't usually occur during the week; he was simply too busy. Janet and I suspected something was going on, but weren't sure what it was. Sure enough, during lunch he informed us that he had bought Dawn a used car. The problem was, this was the first that Sylvia had heard of this. Ken, figuring it was best to get forgiveness and not permission, had us there to serve as a buffer. Needless to say, the temperature dropped and the tension could be cut with a knife. Immediately Janet and I knew why we had been invited to lunch. We were there to protect Ken from Sylvia's wrath! We've laughed about it over the years, but at the time it was not a laughing matter... not to Sylvia, anyway.

As is true with several friends we've made in the various places we've lived over the years, we have stayed in touch with Sylvia and Ken. We were down to see them just three or four years ago. So you can imagine that the news hit us pretty hard a couple of months ago when we heard that Ken had contracted ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease). Janet and I knew right away that we would have to make plans to go see them, which we did last weekend.

Not surprisingly, our friends are resolutely determined to take it a day at a time. They don't whine about their lot in life; they face it with the depth of strength and faith that inspires me in a way that is hard to describe. They want to use this experience to give witness to their children and grandchildren, their neighbors and friends, the folks who are their church family – to everybody they know – that God will see them through this difficult experience.

They are determined not to give up, nor to give in. Sylvia works with Ken every day with his exercises, and they are attempting to go about their lives as best they can, with the hope that is simply a part of who they are. Sylvia told Janet that in one of their private moments this weekend Ken said to her, "You know, Janet and Randy must love me a lot to come all the way down here to see me." He will never know how right he really is.

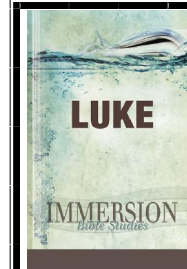
The third annual Racial Unity Service will be Sunday, March 6, 6:00 p.m., at Second Baptist Church.
