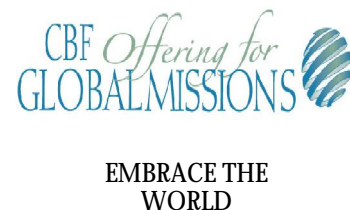

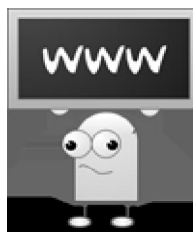

"Attention is what churches get when their stories deal not with Incarnation, Trinity, Resurrection, or Atonement, but with finances or sex." – Longtime religious history professor and author Martin E. Marty.

"I also would have steered clear of politics. I'm grateful for the opportunities God gave me to minister to people in high places; people in power have spiritual and personal needs like everyone else, and often they have no one to talk to. But looking back, I know I sometimes crossed the line, and I wouldn't do that now." – Evangelist Billy Graham, responding to e-mailed questions from *Christianity Today*.

"The level and frequency of criticisms toward pastors and other leaders has increased significantly in the past several years. I call this resurgence in criticisms 'the Great Distraction' because it often causes leaders to lose focus on leading their churches in the Great Commission." – Thom S. Rainer, president of LifeWay Christian Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Led by Anne Lea Patterson, the study will take place in the church library on Wednesday evenings at 5:45 beginning March 23.

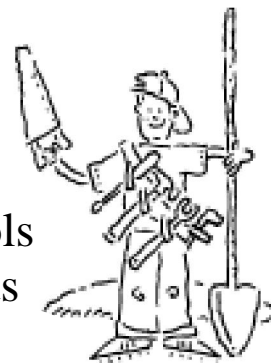

We will have a special-called business meeting on Wednesday, March 30, to vote on submitting the grant to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship *It's Time* grant program staff.

Our prayer in this project is to take our church to the front on Kavanaugh as we provide a service the community wants, and to build relationships for Christ with people. We have felt God's blessings throughout the planning. We hope you'll join us to serve and to share Christ through PHBC as we move forward.
