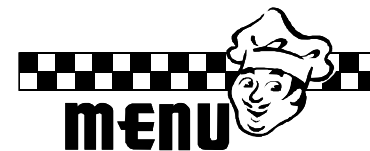

It is my hope that this will be a reflective season that finds each of us more fully committed to the One who gave himself for us. I encourage you to study these texts and come prepared to worship in spirit and in truth. Who knows, it might just become a defining moment for you.

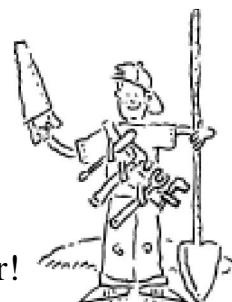
