Last week you should have received the mailing from us in regard to this year's Deacon election process. Every year, when we do this, questions are raised. This time around, they were brought up by the Deacons themselves. A good deal of conversation was given to it this past Sunday in their regular monthly meeting. So, at their request, I am attempting in this column to explain how we do the election process in such a way that it will be easier to understand. And since your responses are due this Sunday, I hope you will give some time and attention to this. It really is quite important.

There are two ballots in your mailing. The first, which has two places for you to write in your nominations, is for members of the Deacon Nomination Committee. The two people who are selected will join the remainder of the committee already in place, and it will be their responsibility to recommend new Deacons to the church. That's the purpose for the other ballot. You are also asked to nominate eight people you think would well serve our church in this ministry and service position. The Nomination Committee will take your recommendations into account, and then present their nominees to the church. Trust me, it's really not quite as difficult as it sounds.

The Deacons thought it might be helpful for you to know who the inactive Deacons are in our church. In other words, the ones who are **not** currently serving a three-year active term. You might want to give consideration to these when you make your nominations. However, we always try to bring new Deacons into the group, so the choices you make do not have to come from this group... at least not all of them. The requirements are that new Deacons must be at least 25 years of age, have been PHBC members for not less than two years, and have at least five years in active Christian service. Now, if you would also like to view a list of church members, to see if you want to nominate someone from the ranks of the "unordained," the best way for you to do that is take a look at our church membership role. And, the best way to do that is by means of our church website. Here's how to do that...

Near the bottom of the home page you will find six columns. The second from the left is headed "Members" in red. Fourth from the top, in that column, is "Member Directory." Click on that and you can immediately see the members and their information, right? No, there's a bit more to it than that. You see, we don't let just anybody take a look at our members' addresses and phone numbers. We value your privacy. In order to look at this information, you must be a member or "Friend of the Church," and you must know the password. Type in the password and then click "Login." All the PHBC members will be right there in front of you.

You don't know the password? Well, I can't very well give it to you here because then there would be other folks who would see it, those who view our website but are not members of the church. So this is what you need to do: e-mail me at rhyde@phbc.com and I'll send it to you. Or, call the church office, identify yourself to MiDonna or Gorma, and they will provide you with it.

Let's do indeed take seriously our Deacon selections. Yes, it is that important.

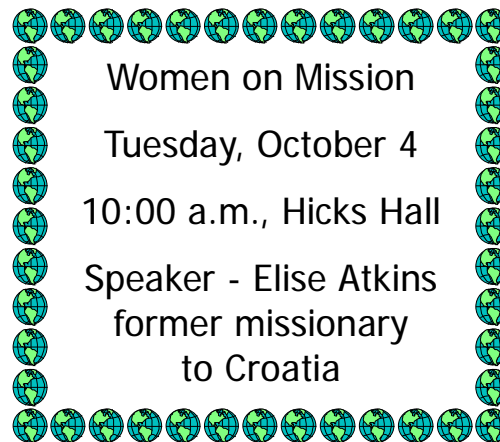

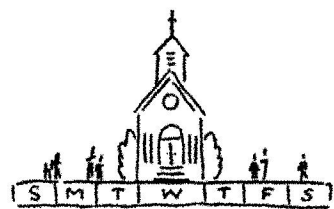

The times for *Midweek* will be the same: supper will be served at 5:15 and worship will begin at 6:00.

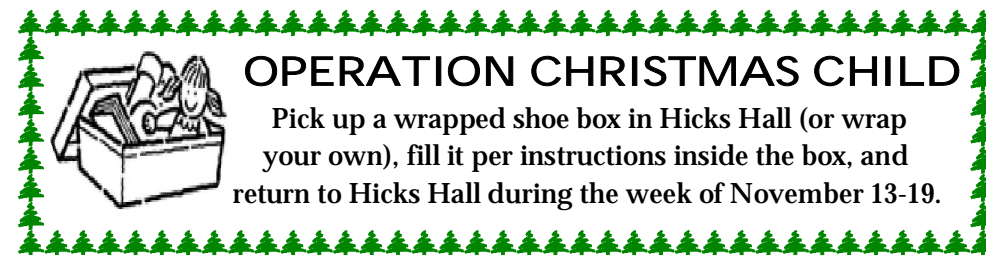
